**STAY ALERT**

especially at dawn and dusk.

**SLOW DOWN**

to increase your reaction time.

**WATCH FOR MOVEMENT**

along roadsides.

**BRAKE.**

don't swerve.

**ANTICIPATE**

for animals to change direction.

**OBEY SIGNS**

including speed limits and-wildlife warning signs.

**USE HIGH BEAMS**

to improve visibility.

**SLOW DOWN**

on blind curves.
